

**Orchards' Future Looks Rosy as Conservation Charity Celebrates  
Grant Award**

Kemerton Conservation Trust (KCT) is delighted to announce it has just been awarded a grant of £19,800 for orchard restoration and conservation in Kemerton as part of a nationwide partnership project led by the National Trust.

The National Trust's **Conserving and Restoring Traditional Orchards in England** project is being funded by Natural England as part of **Natural England's Countdown 2010 Biodiversity Action Fund**, which supports projects that help to halt the loss of biodiversity by 2010 as part of the Europe-wide Countdown 2010 initiative.

The grant, which will run until March 2011, will provide funding for KCT to resume the restoration and wildlife management of orchards at Kemerton, including orchard mapping and assessment of existing trees, restoration of older trees, pruning where required and some replanting. A major survey of orchard wildlife will be carried out using recent and fresh data, and efforts will be made to identify many of the unnamed trees. The grant donors hope that the local community will get involved through volunteering and that marketing of the fruit will be stimulated.

Thanks to earlier work by KCT in this field, and support from the local trained volunteer group 'Kemerton Orchard Workers' and others, the Trust already has experience in restoring and managing orchards and therefore may be asked to host visits from other participants and orchard owners.

*"Receiving this grant is excellent news for the trust. KCT has five orchards under conservation management and the possibility of restoring two more but a lack of funds has restricted work in recent years. With this long term funding now secured, KCT will be able to restore and monitor these valuable wildlife habitats. I view this funding as reward for everyone's hard work."
